We pray that in 2024 St James will be a community where we are *Growing Together* as we love one another through using the gifts that God has given us.

In addition to all the ways in which we are currently *Growing Together* we are going to invest in the following fresh opportunities.

Rekindling existing gifts and discovering new ones

This is an opportunity for us to discover and use our gifts to help us all grow in our gifts together. We will be offering a course to help enable this.

Launching new small groups

There are a number of people who would like to join a small group at St James. We want to provide space for people to deepen their relationships. Within this we want to invest in developing leaders to lead these groups.

Relaunching Alpha

In 2024 we are planning to run two Alpha courses. We will be running a smaller scale one in the Spring and then a larger one in the Autumn. If you are interested in being involved in running these please speak to Josh Grimwood.

Key Teaching for the Year

During the course of the year, amongst other teaching, we will be running series on: Romans, 1 Corinthians, teaching on stewardship and looking at the Apostles Creed.



Meal for Six

This is an opportunity for you to meet people you have not met before within the church. We will publicise more details about this in due course.

Launching a new Evening Service

A relaxed open space for extended worship where we can wait on God and invite his Holy Spirit to minister to us. A place where people can explore and grow in their gifts.

Hear about child sponsorship from Compassion

On the 12th May we have a representative from Compassion visiting us to talk about their work and how we as a community can be involved.



We can all be part of God's mission in many ways, and one important way is through our giving.

Last year our income was £165k. In the week-round ministry and outreach we believe God has called us to, we are looking to spend £174k, of which £112k will need to come from us as church members. That is an increase of £898 per month, a 10.6% increase. We realise that this increase is unlikely to be achieved this year, so our aim is to reach this target within 2 years. We are therefore looking for an increase in giving of £449 per month, which is a 5% rise each year.



When we are thinking about our own giving, here are three tips:

- Think first about how generous God has been to us in Jesus Christ. It all starts with His grace to us.
- Reflect on Jesus' example of His generous and sacrificial grace as a pattern for our giving.
- Use the biblical guide of a tithe (10%) as a benchmark for our own giving.

WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO?

36% £62k	PARISH SHARE Each Parish Church pays a share to Coventry Diocese. This covers clergy stipend, pension, training and the upkeep of the vicarage.	
11% £20k	,	
17% 30k	ADMINISTRATION AND CENTRAL SUPPORT Keeping our church working effectively, including the salary of our part time office administrator, Rebekah Cassar, along with printing, stationery, equipment and general church supplies.	
26% £45k	PROPERTY This includes the upkeep of the Church, Church Centre, St James on the Grange, Watercall Avenue, cleaners salary, and heating and lighting. Any major material repairs come from this allocation, unless already allocated from reserves.	
10% £17k	OUTWARD GIVING Our mission budget enables us to support Mission Partners locally and globally. Also, this includes a contribution to the Deanery Support Fund for churches who are less financially well off.	

HOW IS THIS FUNDED?

Together we share in the responsibility for keeping the church running. Over 60% of our income comes from voluntary gifts from 89 families and individuals. The remaining income comes from the letting of our premises and other parish related fees.

WHY SHOULD I PLEDGE?

Pledging helps us to steward our finances prudently and to be confident in the achievement of our Vision.

HOW DO I GIVE?
